


School Dinner Menu (£2.75) per day or free to Reception, Year 1 & 2 pupils)

The children have each decorated the inside of a box to represent the ocean and have created their own sea creatures to live inside. We have used a wide range of materials and the children have enjoyed discussing and creating different ways to represent parts of the sea.



## **Adventurers**

We started the week with some transition activities. The children are all getting excited about starting in their new classes!

This week we have worked on some comprehension activities in English. We have scratched up on making predictions, and we have considered how authors use vocabulary to paint a picture in our imaginations. This also linked nicely with Mrs Cascarini's assembly this week on creativity, where we talked about daydreaming and using our imagination!

In maths, we have started some multiplication and fractions. The year 2s have been counting in  $\frac{1}{2}$ 's; whilst the year 1s have been making equal groups.

In Science, we worked together to research our favourite animals, using some of our knowledge of this terms topic. We had to find out their habitat and where they are in the food chain! The children are still talking about their dioramas from last week: see below for some photos of these.







# **Discoverers**

In English we finished our descriptive write up about our planet. This week in Maths we've been looking at statistics using pie charts, bar graphs and tallies. In History/R.E this week we have been learning about the religious black stone or stones in different faiths. During Art this week we have learnt some old English language writing, we have then drawn initials before colouring in a metallic style using metallic pens. Finally in PSHE we were making a school advertisement leaflet promoting our school.




















Little Light update.


